MASTER-PLANNERS WORK WITH 'WONDERFUL ASSETS'

This architects' impression is of Hengrove Park now built on the old Whitchurch Airfield. It was planned by consultants Lifschutz Davidson Sandiland who have now been appointed to carry out master-planning for the Western Harbour Scheme over the coming year.

According to their website they are 'a multi-talented team of 70 architects, design consultants and urban planners based at the inspiring Island Studios in West London. We bring fresh thinking to every project and achieve success with architecture that is designed for people and built for change. We are defined by a sense of curiosity and a capacity to solve problems with good humour and consistently brilliant ideas, more than a single brand or style.'

<u>The vision for the Western Harbour</u> assures us that the area is to "be a distinctive gateway to Bristol", "support a thriving community", "build on its tradition of innovation", and "embrace freedom and nature".

Lifschutz said: "We're delighted our team has been selected to masterplan Western Harbour, working with Bristol City Council and local communities to map out the future of one of the most extraordinary places in the UK to suffer from under investment.

"The site is framed by three Brunel masterpieces, the Clifton Suspension Bridge, his abandoned Grade II* swivel bridge and the SS Great Britain to the east.

"And it's studded with other wonderful assets including the Floating Harbour locks and Cumberland Basin, Silvia Crowe's landscape, parkland and mudflats. "As a student in Bristol living on the Hotwells Road (sic), I remember seeing the hulk of the SS Great Britain being towed into the Cumberland Basin over 50 years ago before being restored in its original dry dock.

Over its 175 year life the central wrought iron structure which supports the Swivel Bridge's weight has corroded badly. A decade ago English Heritage (now Historic England) funded materials for volunteers to build a protective roof. Known affectionately as the 'Chicken Shed' or 'Brunel's Bothy' the timber structure remains sound, but its felt roof covering has aged.

We are half way through renewing the

felt, and painting the Bridge itself to further reduce the rate of corrosion. Do come and help us on the following days:

MV BALMORAL

This historic ship, built as a car ferry in 1947 is being restored to sea-going, passenger-carrying condition by volunteers. You think we have a difficult task on BOB, but at least our Bridge can't sink! The Ship has secured £174K funding from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for essential hull inspection and repairs, so she went into Albion Dry Dock on 17th April for about 4 weeks to carry out water-jetting of the hull, inspection of propellers and rudders, repairs to plates, and general repainting of the hull.



CONSERVATION POLICY

We are preparing a Conservation Policy statement to support Regeneration Team & their consultants, and make them aware of the aspirations of local people on heritage assets. Support has been good, and we shall be circulating it shortly.

CUMBERLAND ROAD BUS GATE

You can drive westwards but not eastwards towards the City along Cumberland Road, but motorists have been driving through the bus gate in the wrong direction, partly because of poor signs. 22,000 penalty notices have been issued, £500,000 of fines incurred, and a petition against the Gate has 1,500 signatures. <u>CLICK HERE</u> for Bristol 24/7 report.
